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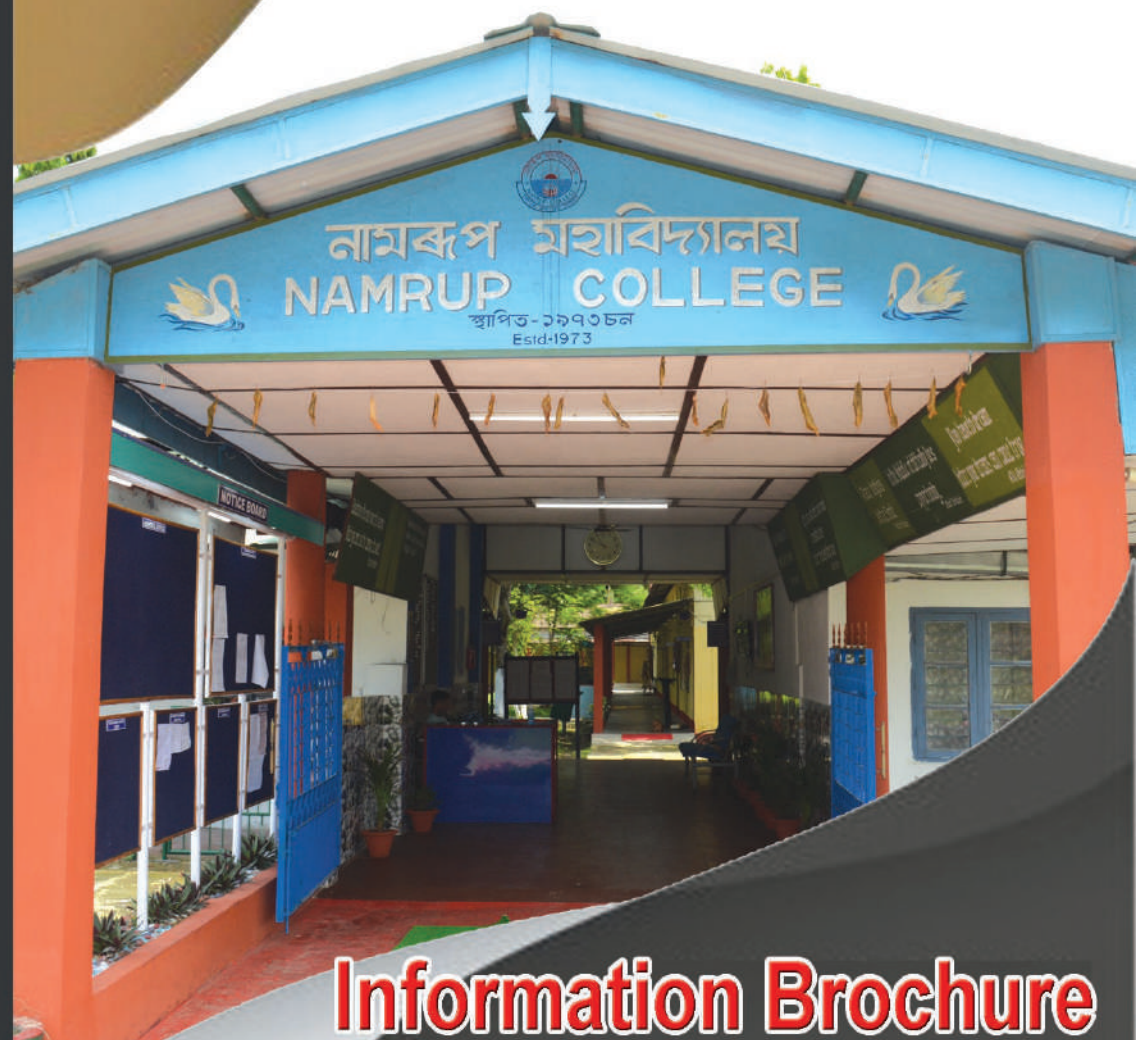

Laboratory



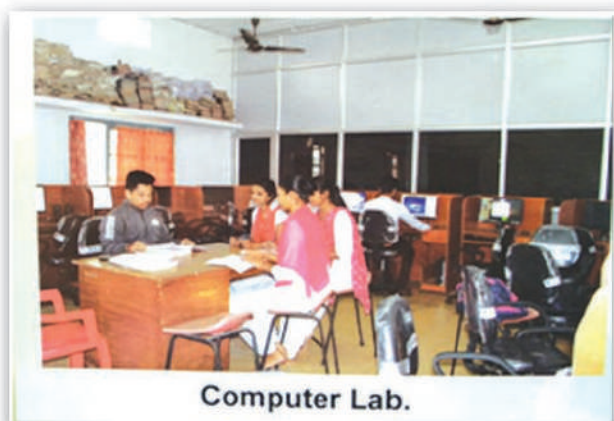

Rules & Regulations for Maintenance of Discipline

- 1) Students admitted to this college must abide by the rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authority. Violation of rules and regulations, irregular attendance, discourtesy to the teachers and staff members, used of physical force, use of filthy obscene language, and willful damage of intitutional property will lead to strict disciplinary action.
- 2) Students should attend regular classes. For irregular students in class, the following regulation will be applied by the college.
 - If he/she remain irregular, notice will be hang on the notice board
 - Still he/she fails to attend the classes; their parent will be informed by the Head of Department (HoD).
 - Still if they are not attending the classes, they have to be produce in front of the principal. Then the principal/authority of the college will take necessary action.
- 3) It is compulsory for all the students to attend the sessional examinations. For particular cases special test will be conducted for absentee students. All the students should secure a minimum of 50% in all the examinations and assignments. If any student is found absent in any of the examinations, he/she must produce an application with the signature of the guardian to the Principal through the Head of the Department.
- 4) As regards attendance in class, a student's shall be eligible to appear in the examination as a regular candidate. At least 75% attendance is required for a regular candidate to be eligible to appear in the examination.
- 5) Ragging is strictly prohibited by law. Any students found indulging in practice of ragging will be liable to strict disciplinary actions in the form of suspension or even expulsion from the intuition.
- 6) Students are required to come to the college in full and proper uniform. No students will be allowed to attend classes without proper uniform.
- 7) Identity card is compulsory for all the students inside college premises. In case of loss of identity card, duplicate card will be issued to the students when he or she apply for it on payment of a fine.
- 8) Students must observe strict silence in between class hours.
- 9) Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the college premises.

- 11) Students must take prior written permission from the Principal for absence in the class for more than two days.
- 12) No students will be allowed to leave the college campus in between 10:00 am to 2:00 pm.
- 13) Students are permitted from bringing mobile phones inside college premises only for educational purposes.
- 14) Students must get consent of the Principal before they plan for a study tour/ sightseeing.
- 15) Pan Masala, Ghutka, Tobacco etc. are strictly prohibited in the college campus. The college tries its best to make it a tobacco free zone.
- 16) Students should abide by the rules and regulations as per recommendation of honorable Supreme Court committee on road safety.

Arts Stream:

Compulsory Subjects: English, MIL (Assamese, Alternative English),

Elective Subjects: Economics, Education, Advance Assamese, History, Bihu, Swadesh Adhayayan (Amalgamation of History & Geography), Mathematics, Political Science, Sociology, Introductory Computer Science.

Science Stream :

Compulsory Subjects: English, MIL (Assamese, Alternative English)

Elective Subjects: Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Introductory Computer Science.

N.B. Introductory Computer Science (ICS) is open to all Arts and Science Stream.

DEGREE COURSE (FYUGP) :

Dibrugarh University has introduced the Four Year Under Graduate Programmes (FYUGP) in choice Based Credit system (CBCS) from 2023.

Minimum eligibility criteria for admission in Four Year Undergraduate programmes:

Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (Class 12) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education and/or Admission test conducted by College/University/National Level Testing Agency/State Level Testing Agency.

Minimum eligibility criteria for multiple entry points of the UG programmes

a. 1st year: Senior Secondary School Leaving Certificate or Higher Secondary (Class 12) Certificate obtained after successful completion of Grade 12 or equivalent stage of education and/or Admission test conducted by College/University/National Level Testing Agency/State Level Testing Agency.

b. 2nd year: A certificate obtained after successful completion of 1 year (2 semesters) of the undergraduate programme. These students are to take admission in the 2nd year within a period of three years from obtaining the UG certificate from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University.

c. 3rd year: A diploma obtained after successful completion of 2 years (4 semesters) of the undergraduate programme. These students are to take admission in the 3rd year UG programme within a period of three years from obtaining the UG diploma from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University.

d. 4th Year (Honours) : A Bachelor's degree after successful completion of three years (6 semesters) of the Undergraduate programme obtained from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University. These students are to complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

e. 4th Year (Honours with Research): A three year Bachelor Degree with a minimum of 7.5 CGPA. The minimum entry requirement for 4th year (Honours/Research) UG programme within a period of three years from obtaining 3 year Bachelor Degree from Dibrugarh University or any other University/institution recognized by Dibrugarh University. These students are to complete the degree within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

1. DIBRUGARH UNIVERSITY OPEN AND DISTANCE LEARNING, NAMRUP COLLEGE STUDY CENTRE

Introduction of Semester System in the undergraduate level limits the number of students enrolled to these programmes as semester system demand a high student-teacher ratio. In order to B.A./B.Sc. Programmes in the Colleges, the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University has introduced the B.A. / B. Sc. in the annual system through distance mode.

Due to limited number of seats in the Post-Graduate classes or for other reasons, a large students, Dibrugarh University decided to introduce Distance Education in the University. The Degree shall have the same STANDARD AND STATUS as the post-graduate degree of the regular students under semester system.

Institutional Biotech Hub

Institutional Biotech Hub of Namrup College is an extension centre of Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India. This hub facilitates the transformation and expansion of biotechnological research based activities among the students of Biological sciences and of other allied subjects. Since its inception in (2013), the hub has been conducting different trainings on biological instrumentation, workshops and seminar for the students of Namrup College and senior secondary schools around the Namrup area. Besides these, Bio-tech hub has conducted skill development programme on mushroom cultivation, vermicompost processing and production, nursery management, animal husbandry and tea plantation technology for the neighbouring youths for economic empowerment and employment generation.

In the year 2019, Biotech hub developed infrastructure for mushroom cultivation, vermicompost processing and nursery management. Biotech hub is now in a position to conduct skill development courses such as -
